

Mass Day Uniform

Girls

Plaid or navy blue uniform jumper, navy blue skirt, grades PK-4

Plaid or navy blue uniform skirt or skort, grades 5-8

White, cotton blouse

Sweater (red, white, navy) optional with or without a zipper

Boys

Navy blue pants, grades PK-8

White dress shirt, button down

Navy blue or uniform plaid tie and a belt (K-8)

Color Days

A color day is a scheduled day during which a student is not required to wear a school uniform. Students also can earn Color Day Passes through participation in various activities throughout the year.

A Color Day Pass **cannot** be used on Mass Days, and students who receive a color day pass must have the pass in their possession on the day they choose to use it.

Acceptable

- Slacks or cargos, shirts/blouses with/without collars
- T-shirts, but no inappropriate logo/slogans
- Jeans, except on “dress up” color days*; no holes, rips or tears
- Shorts are permitted all year long but must be acceptable length.

Not Acceptable

- Low-waist, snug, form-fitting pants
- Revealing shirts
- Shirt with inappropriate logo, slogans, sayings, advertisements; subject to the principal’s discretion
- Tank tops or shirts with spaghetti straps; tops must meet the three-finger tip rule.

* **Dress up color day**—These days will be announced in advance. On these special occasions girls wear dresses or skirts, and boys wear slacks/dress shirt/tie of their choice.

Wearing unacceptable color day clothing will result in the student contacting parents for a change of clothes, and the loss of the next scheduled color day. An earned color day pass **cannot** be used when a student has lost a color day privilege.
